PAVILION EXHIBITS – GENERAL

- 1) An exhibit may only be entered in one class.
- 2) Exhibits must have been completed within the 18 months prior to the 2024 Nowra Show unless otherwise specified.
- 3) All prize winning exhibits in each class shall be displayed in the Pavilion together with as many other exhibits as space will permit.
- 4) It is not always possible to display the whole article (eg: quilts) as sufficient space may not be available.
- 5) Exhibits cannot be connected to Mains Power during the Show.
- 6) Pavilion will close at 10.00 pm on Saturday and re-open on Sunday between 10.00 am and 11.00 am for removal of exhibits. Exhibitors must produce numbered Exhibitor Receipt to collect corresponding numbered Exhibit. Exhibitor receipt will be issued with competing Ticket.
- 7) No exhibit may be removed from the Pavilion before Sunday morning.
- 8) Prizemoney will be paid on Sunday between 10.00 am and 11.00 am.
- 9) Prizemoney not collected within a week of the show will be a donation to the Society.
- 10) Unless otherwise arranged, the Society will not be responsible for exhibits unclaimed by 12 noon Sunday.
- 11) The Society shall not be responsible in the event of any loss or damage to any exhibit howsoever arising.

Pavilion will open at 8am - 10am Thursday 8th February for the staging of general exhibits.

Pavilion will be open between **6.00 pm and 7.00 pm Wednesday and from 8am to 10am Thursday** for staging of exhibits in **Cut Flowers, Decorative Flowers, Junior Decorative Flower and Dahlia sections.**

Judging commences **10.30 am Thursday**. Photography section judged one week prior to Show. Judges: Local Show Societies are interested in obtaining the names of people willing to judge Pavilion Sections.

Judges will award (1) 150th Commemorative Medal in each Section.

- **For competition it is advisable to check that the bottle is clean around the top and the inside of the lid is clean.**
- **The jar should be full (above the shoulder of the jar).**
- **Sauces (except pasta) need to be strained for competition purposes.**
- **The taste of the flavour named should not be overpowered by another flavour eg: the taste of tomato relish should not be overpowered by chilli.**

Hints for exhibition cooking : Read the schedule carefully - check closing time

- **Biscuits, pikelets, scones, slices should be even sized and dainty**
- **Slices should be approx. 4cm squares**
- **Don't turn cake onto wire rack, marks are regarded as decoration, place on tea towel.**
- **Coconut ice should be pale pink in colour, no coconut on top and 4cm squares**
- **Don't use soft icing unless specified**
- **Neat presentation is very important**
- **Note: be aware that in hot weather some exhibits will deteriorate, i.e. jelly**
- **Please check your oven temperature to avoid over baking of your exhibits**

10335 Orange Cake - Iced (using the following recipe)

First Prize: \$20.00 + Ribbon, Second Prize: \$10.00

Recipe from Mrs Voni Muller, well known exhibitor & Life Member of Nowra Show Society.

Recipe to be followed:

Orange Cake

125g butter

1 cup castor sugar

2 eggs

2 cups SR flour + pinch of salt (sifted)

2tsp grated orange rind

2tsp orange juice

1 cup milk

Pre-heat oven to 180°C. Grease 8 – 9inch tin.

Cream butter and sugar, add orange rind then eggs, beating after each addition. Add half the flour, salt, juice and milk to mixture and beat. Mix in all remaining ingredients. Pour into cake tin. Bake at 180°C for about 50 minutes. When cool, ice with orange icing. **Decorate with orange peel cut into small shapes.**

Icing

2 cups icing sugar/mixture, 1 heaped tsp butter (melted), Vanilla to taste, Warm Water

A few drops of Orange Juice

Sift icing sugar/mixture into a bowl. Add melted butter then mix to spreading consistency by slowly adding warm water. Add vanilla to taste. Add more icing sugar or water if needed to achieve desired consistency.

HINTS FOR BAKING SCONES FOR EXHIBITIONS/SHOWS

First of all, read the Show Schedule thoroughly.

Have a hot oven, know your oven. When cooked, brush off any excess flour, top and underneath, with pastry brush. To avoid flour on bottom of scones, line the baking tray with baking paper. Scones should be medium brown on top and light brown underneath. Sometimes it makes a difference whatever scone tray is used, for the bottom of the scones. Experiment prior to Show. Scones must be same size and shape, if possible. If mixture is too soft, gradually add a bit more flour. It is better to have a soft mixture and add extra flour than to have a stiff mixture and add extra liquid as this can make the top hard and the scone heavy. When cooked, cover with tea towel to keep the top soft.
